

## Normandy Summer Tour stops in Saint-Lô



The **Normandy Summer Tour** was created in 2023 with the aim of attracting riders from the American continent to Normandy's international competitions, by creating a dynamic between shows of similar levels.

**In 2023, the Normandy Summer Tour will involve:**

- **5 events** in Cabourg, Deauville (2 competitions), Chantilly (associate partner) and Saint-Lô,
- **20 days** of competition and **99 classes**,
- **850 riders and 2,100 horses**,
- **30 nations** represented,
- a total prize money of **€890,200**.

Thanks to the Normandy Summer Tour, more than 50 riders from the American continent are present in Normandy for these 5 competitions, representing the United States, Brazil, Colombia, Chile, Peru, Ecuador, Mexico and Canada.

**At the end of the 3rd stage**, held in Chantilly in mid-July, **Pedro Veniss**, Olympic rider for the Brazilian team, **Laura Kraut** (USA), double Olympic team gold medallist, both selected in their national teams for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, and **Giavanni Rinaldi** (USA) are **leading the 3/4\* circuit**, while **Lindsay Douglas** (USA), **Rachel Penner** (USA) and **Felipe Amaral** (BRA) make up the provisional **top 3 in the 1\* circuit**.

**The Saint-Lô event will take place from 3 to 6 August during the CSI 3/2/1\* at the Normandie Horse Show.**

Six nations competing on the circuit will be represented, including 3 Brazilian riders in the provisional top 10: Pedro Veniss, Felipe Amaral and Pedro Junqueira Muylaert.

The Challenge prize-giving ceremony will be held at the end of the final leg, in Deauville from 10 to 13 August. **On this occasion, the winners of the 3/4\* and 1\* circuits will be presented with a personalised painting and statuette by animal artist Olivier Jouanneteau.**
